Neighborly Advice *by Angie Alexander*

I know all of us enjoy a community where we can rely on each other to be conscientious and diligent about keeping our property looking good which in turn keeps our neighborhood looking great. First impressions speak volumes about our neighborhood to potential home buyers and with current housing market challenges even the smallest efforts to keep our properties in order can reap large rewards for our neighborhood. In that spirit, we wanted to share a few City of Livonia ordinance requirements with you to ensure we all do our part to keep our neighborhood beautiful:



Trash Collection — The city prohibits placing trash at the curb earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the evening before collection.



Lawn Maintenance — Grass / weed height cannot exceed 9 inches. If you live near an unoccupied home that does not have regular lawn maintenance, please feel free to cut the lawn. The city will not maintain unoccupied properties. It is in our best interest as neighbors to lend a hand in maintaining these lawns.



Parking car on a front lawn is prohibited by city ordinance. The only approved use of the front of a property is for landscaping including trees, shrubs, etc. and a driveway.



Snow / Ice Removal — if snowfall occurs at night, snow and ice must be removed by 12 noon of the next day. If snowfall occurs during the day, it must be removed by 12 noon of the following day.

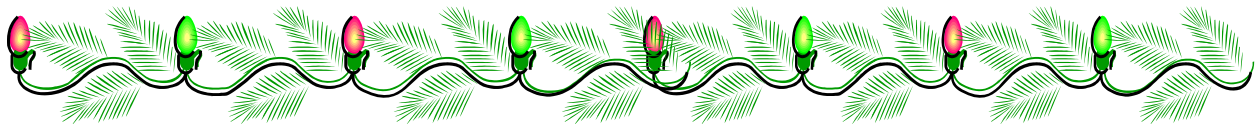
